


The mission of the Körner's Folly Foundation is to foster an appreciation for history, the arts, and enterprise through the preservation and interpretation of Körner's Folly.

Our vision is to be a place of connection between the past and the future, between the arts and industry, and among people who share a common appreciation for innovation.








### Expenditures 2024-2025







Our education, special event, and program volunteers logged over 800 hours this year and Intern Cooper Johnson helped us research and create labels for artworks in our collection!




The Piedmont Wind Symphony Residency at Historic Körner's Folly is a year-long artistic collaboration celebrating Forsyth County's shared heritage of music, history, and community.

Each concert reactivates Cupid's Park Theatre-the original entertainment space designed by visionary artist Jule Gilmer Körner-and brings to life the sounds of the 1890-1910 era through periodinspired performances.

Together, these organizations share a mission to enrich community life through the arts, preserve local history, and ensure equitable access to meaningful cultural experiences.



#### CUPID'S PARK THEATRE

Tucked within the upper floors of Historic Körner's Folly, Cupid's Park Theatre is one of America's earliest known private theaters and a rare architectural treasure. Built in the late 19th century by artist and designer Jule Gilmer Körner, the theatre served as a creative playground for the Körner family and a gathering space for Kernersville residents to experience live music, dramatic performances, and community events. With its ornate hand-painted ceilings, whimsical design, and intimate acoustics, Cupid's Park Theatre embodies the spirit of innovation and artistic expression that defined the Gilded Age. Today, through the Piedmont Wind Symphony Residency at Körner's Folly, this remarkable venue once again becomes a living stagebridging the past and present by bringing historically inspired performances to contemporary audiences from across Winston-Salem and Forsyth County.
