

Crafting with the Körners: *Decorative Molding Masks*

Time: Approximately 45
minutes

Age: 6+ (with cutting assistance)

Materials List:

- Mask template (p. 3 & 4)
- Crayons, color pencils, or markers
- Scissors
- Popsicle stick
- Elmer's glue or similar




Did you know that Körner's Folly has over 10,000 feet of decorative molding? These architectural elements sometimes feature faces and figures from literature or mythology. This year, for Halloween, we're masking masks from some of the faces Jule Körner included in his designs!



The faces shown here are located in the decorative molding of the Foyer, greeting visitors as they arrive!

On the left is a Court Jester figure, a symbol of common sense and honesty and on the right we see a Lion, a symbol of courage and majesty.

Step 1:

Choose your mask template. Will you be a Lion, a Jester, or both?!



Step 2 & 3:

Add color and then use scissors to cut mask out. To cut out eyes and mouth, pinch paper and make a small cut in the middle of the space for scissors to fit through.



Step 4:

Add glue to back of mask. Elmer's glue works best, but glue sticks can work too.



Step 5:

Place popsicle stick on top of glue. Press down and hold to let glue set for at least 10 seconds.
